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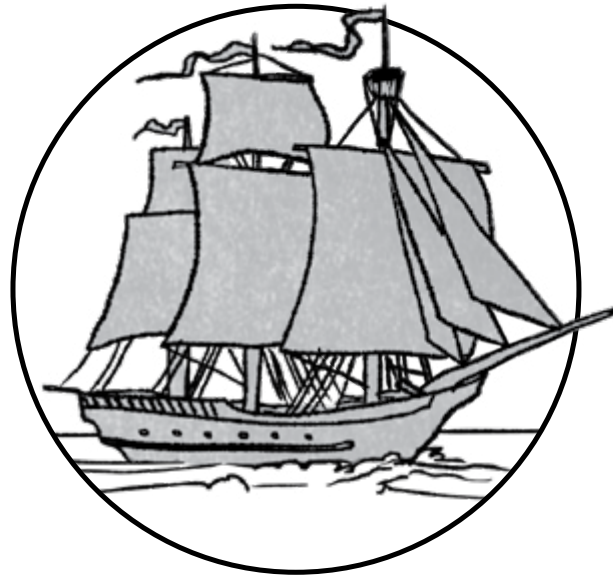
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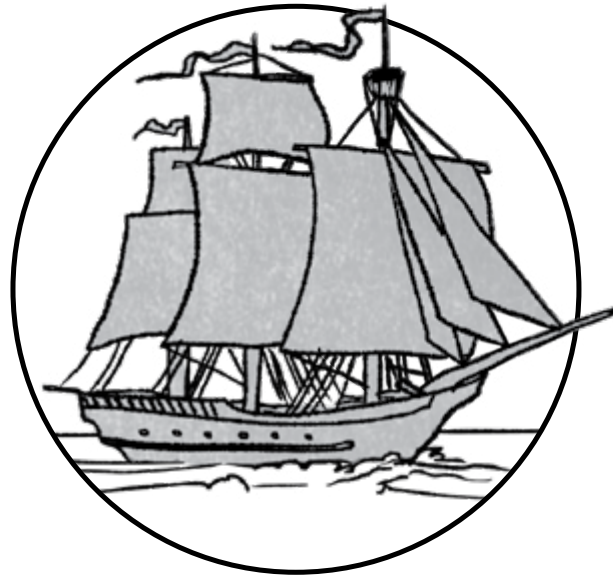
La guerra de 1812 1

IN CONGRESS, JULY 4, 1776.

The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America.

When in the Course of human Events, it becomes necessary for one People to dissolve the Political Bonds which have connected them with another, and to assume among the Powers of the earth, the separate and equal Station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them; a decent Respect to the Opinions of Mankind requires that they should declare the Causes which impel them to the Separation. We hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just Powers from the Consent of the Governed, — That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its Foundation on such Principles, and organizing its Powers on such Form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient Causes; and accordingly all Resolutions ought to be preceded by Declarations of the Causes, which impel them to alter them, that they may present to the World a more conclusive Proof of the Necessity of their Separation, and that they may in all Governments receive the same Amount of Attention. We therefore the Representatives of the united States of America, in General Congress assembled, solemnly publish and declare, That the thirteen united States of America, are Freemen and Independent States, that they are absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political Connection between them and that State, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as Freemen and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Alliance, establish Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do. And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm Assurance on the Part of the thirteen united States of America, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.

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We the People

of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby adopt, ratify, and establish the Constitution for the United States of America.

Article I
 Section 1
 All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.
 Section 2
 The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
 Section 3
 The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Article II
 Section 1
 The executive Power shall be vested in a President of the United States of America.
 Section 2
 The President shall hold Office, from the beginning of his Term, which shall be four Years; and he shall be re-eligible to the Office for no more than one Term; but if any person be chosen President after the expiration of his former Term, he shall not be re-eligible until after the expiration of one Year thereafter.
 Section 3
 The President shall have the Honor and Splendor of Royalty, he shall hold Office during his natural Life, and shall be impeachable, and liable to Removal from Office by the Senate.

Article III
 Section 1
 The judicial Power shall be vested in one Supreme Court, and in such inferior Courts as the Congress may from time to time ordain and establish.
 Section 2
 The President may nominate, and, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate, shall appoint Judges of the Supreme and inferior Courts, and all other Officers of the United States, whose Appointments are not herein otherwise provided for; and they shall hold their Offices during the good Behavior of the Judges, and the Term of Years of the other Officers, which shall be determined by Law.

Article IV
 Section 1
 The federal Government shall guarantee to every State in this Union a Republican Form of Government, and shall protect each State against Invasion, and against the Violence of domestic Violence.
 Section 2
 The Privileges and Immunities of Citizens of the United States shall be secured to every Citizen in every State.

The original and authentic Copy of the Constitution shall be deposited in the Secretary of State, and a true Copy thereof shall be sent to every State.
