The War of 1812 2

We the People

of the United States in conformity with the original intention of the framers of the Constitution

Article I
Section 1
All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2
The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3
The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Article II
Section 1
The executive Power shall be vested in a President of the United States of America.

Section 2
The President shall hold Office, during the Term of four Years; and he shall be eligible for one Term only, unless he shall have been re-elected.

Section 3
No Person except a natural born Citizen, or who was born under the Jurisdiction of the United States, shall be eligible to the Office of President.

Article III
Section 1
The judicial Power shall be vested in one Supreme Court, and in such inferior Courts as the Congress may from time to time ordain and establish.

Article IV
Section 1
The United States shall guarantee to every State in this Union a Republican Form of Government.
